RK Dixon needs your help in making sure less of those cartridges end up in a landfill. Below are three different options you can choose from to help our environment just run better!



Please check your Canon toner container box - you may already have a prepaid return label enclosed. If so, please follow directions for returning your cartridge.



You may already have your own recycling center in your office or community. Canon has engraved a plastic resin code on many of their toner cartridges, meaning many of them are safe for local recycling. Please look for the SPI symbol (recycle arrows) on your toner container and recycle accordingly.



If you are not able to recycle your toner cartridges locally, you may send them back to Canon where they will make sure they are recycled appropriately.
